Graduation Plan Types

- Basic: All students start here (25 credits)
 - Honors: Basic with additional credits
 - Modified: 25 credits in different fields, requires documented need/team meeting
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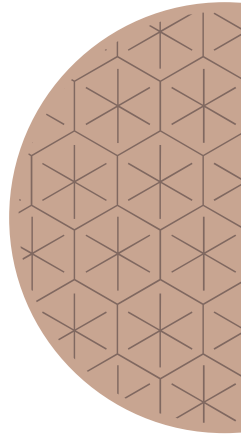
Basic Diploma Requirements

UNDERSTAND the LANGUAGE first:

- 0.5 credit is one semester
- You have required credits, anything that is over the need in a certain field will count as an elective. EX: you only need 1 credit of PE but you take it three years, 1.0 will count towards PE, 2.0 will count towards electives
- There are other ways to earn credit:
 - College courses (turn in your transcripts)
 - Drivers ed hours= elective credit
 - 130 work hours = elective credit (up to 5 credits for a basic or honors)
 - Other approved coursework– check with me first

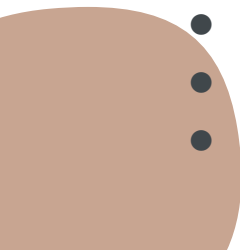
Basic Diploma Requirements

- 4 credits communications (english)
- 3 credits math
- 3 credits science
- 3 credits social studies
 - Global studies
 - US history
 - Econ/Gov
- 1 credit health
- 1 credit PE
- 1 credit senior project
- 3 credits of language, arts, CTE
- 6 credits of electives



Typical Plan

- 4 CM: All four years english or three years with eng 11 and writ 121/122 junior year and none senior year
- 3 credits math: first three with option for fourth
- 3 credits science: first three or first two and senior year
- 3 credits social studies
 - Global studies: sophomore
 - US history: junior
 - Econ/Gov: senior
- 1 credit health: freshman
- 1 credit PE: any
- 1 credit senior project: senior
- 3 credits of language, arts, CTE: first three, any
- 6 credits of electives: all years

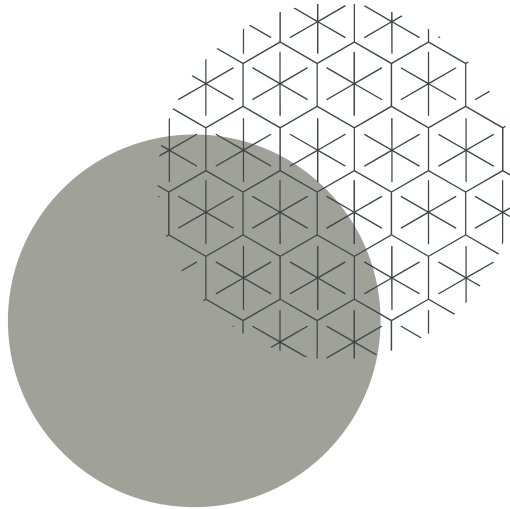

Side Note:

**You need 25 credits but have 28
worth of classes:**

- **Lighter load senior year**
- **More room for electives**
- **More room if needed for credit recovery**



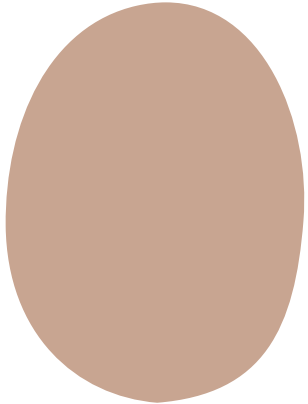
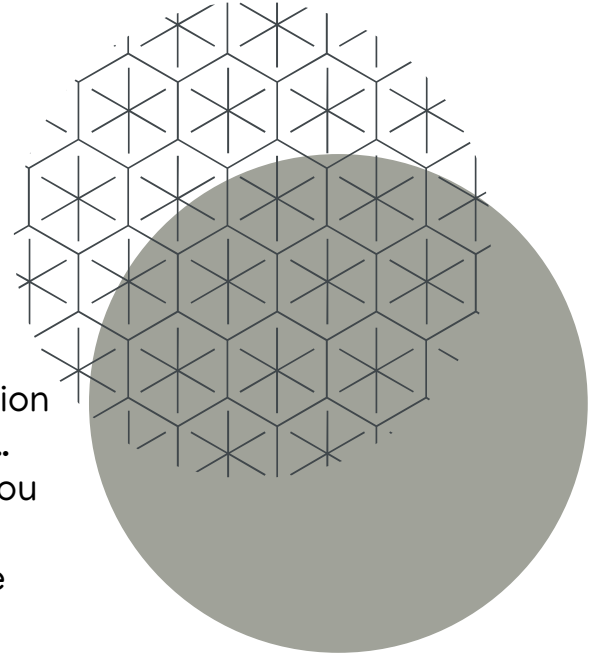
What happens if I fail a class...

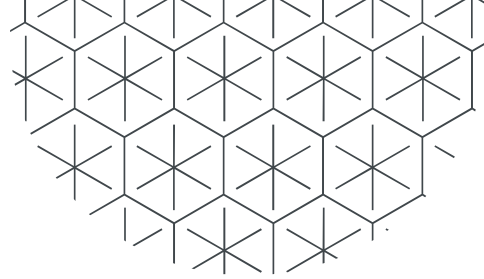
- If a required credit, you will take it again either next semester/year or online during the summer
- Some summers we offer intensive summer school programs that allow for credit recovery in only a couple of weeks
- Some teachers offer an “incomplete” where you have two weeks to complete required coursework to pass the class. This is not always the case.
